Pastor's Meditation

One Word

I was at a Bible study recently where the pastor leading the opening prayer had a wonderful devotion that I want to share with you and encourage you to do.

Pastor Drex asked each person in the group to pause for sixty seconds and to listen for the one word that God is speaking to them at this time. There were about seven in the class and we all dutifully were silent for the appointed time.

In my mind I envisioned a giant wheel like the one on Wheel of Fortune which was spinning and spinning but instead of landing on an amount of money or "Bankrupt", the wheel spun passed many words. Many words flashed through my mind but when the wheel stopped it was clearly on the word "peace". Other participants said their word was "focus", "patience", "beauty". I encourage you to do this. You can do this in a group or alone. When in a group you don't have to share the word which came to you if you would rather not.

Reflecting a little more on the word that I chose, peace is certainly something we need in this world today. Jesus says in John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."

It seems today that the world is certainly better at giving fear than peace. What a blessing it is to know that our God gives to us "the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding" that will "guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." Philippians 4: 7

We don't really "understand" the rain in Summer but we can appreciate how it washes over us and refreshes us.

The Story behind "The Old Rugged Cross"

As a Methodist evangelist, George Bennard wrote the first verse of "The Old Rugged Cross" in Albion, Michigan, in the fall of 1912 as a response to ridicule that he had received at a revival meeting. Bennard traveled with Ed E. Mieras from Chicago to Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin where they held Evangelistic meetings at the Friends Church from December 29, 1912, to January 12, 1913. During the meetings Rev. George Bennard finished "The Old Rugged Cross" and on the last night of the meetings, Bennard and Mieras performed it as a duet before a full house with Pearl Torstensen Berg, organist for the meeting, as accompanist.

The hymn uses a sentimental popular song form with a verse/chorus pattern in 6, 8 time and it speaks of the writer's adoration of Christ and His sacrifice at Calvary. Bennard retired to Reed City, Michigan, and the town maintains a museum dedicated to his life and ministry. A memorial has also been created in Youngstown at Lake Park Cemetery. A plaque commemorating the first performance of the song stands in front of the Friend's Church in Sturgeon Bay, WI.

"The Old Rugged Cross" has been a country gospel favorite ever since it became the title song of Ernest Tubb's 1952 gospel album; it has been performed by some of the twentieth century's most important recording artists.




From the beginning of Lutheran World Relief in 1945, you have been a foundational rock through the Quilt & Kit Ministry. While the work is not yet done, thankfully your love is ever expansive and continues to grow. Journey with us through some of the highlights of the last eight decades — and 136 countries — of your Christian stewardship.



"I remember a trip to a quilt distribution in Niger. The quilts were in bales and when they were cut open, they started to grow. They expanded as if to take a breath, ready to offer warmth and love. I looked up, and all I could see was a large cloud of dust. In that cloud were hundreds of people — men, women and children — coming to get quilts. As soon as they got them, they would hold them to their chest, as if hugging it to their hearts. Isn't that what quilters are doing? Stitching us all together through their love."

The Good Samaritan Quilt Plaza is started at LWR Headquarters in Baltimore. Bricks are engraved with the names of loved ones and congregations. The bricks make a pattern called "Many Trips Around the World" and represent the distribution of millions of quilts and kits.



A massive explosion occurs in the Beirut port, considered one of the largest non-nuclear explosions in history. Sadly almost everything at the port was destroyed, yet all three containers of LWR Quilt & Kits are miraculously found safe.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF



Lutheran World Relief is founded following World War II. Within the first three months of 1946, 2,260 bales of clothing and bedding, plus 245 bags of shoes, were shipped to five countries in Europe. By March there were an estimated 20,000 bales of clothing, or 2 million pounds, available in the warehouse.



First kits begin. There have been many variations including Kiddie Kits (such as the Palestinian boys receiving these kits in Jordan, 1962), Health Kits and Clothing Kits. Today, LWR distributes four types: Personal Care Kits, Baby Care Kits, School Kits and Fabric Kits.



When Hurricane Katrina causes unfathomable devastation, LWR quilters and kit makers send aid to neighbors in their own backyard, a historic and singular distribution.



In Tanzania, quilts are used to reduce stunting. Energy used by small children staying warm often expends precious calories — calories they can't afford to spend. By having the warmth of quilts, children are growing stronger and taller.



When Russian troops invade **Ukraine** in February 2022, our amazing community bands together to mount the largest humanitarian response in Lutheran World Relief history.



The Quilt & Kit Ministry — our longest running program — expands to reach neighbors in need in the United States just as hurricanes Helene and Milton devastate the Southeast.

EASS Builders of Hope Program

Casey Ellis at EASS has provided us with the following information for anyone interested in volunteering as a Mentor or Budget Coach in the Builders of Hope program.

♦ What is a volunteer Mentor?

A mentor is a volunteer who commits to walking alongside individuals living in the Builders of Hope TL program. A mentor encourages an individual to set life skill goals. These goals may be set around parenting, cleaning, cooking, grocery shopping, meal planning, childcare, or other needs that may arise. A mentor encourages based off lived experience. Mentors vary and may not always have a family to work with in the program.

What is a volunteer Budget Coach?

A Budget Coach is a volunteer who commits to walking alongside individuals living in the Builders of Hope TL program by helping them create, track and stick to a budget. A budget coach reviews weekly spending habits and provides creative ideas on ways to save. A main component to the program is saving so it is critical that participants work with their budget coach to meet the minimum savings requirements each month. Budget coaches will also assist participants in understanding their credit scores and provide suggestions on how to improve scores.

What is the Time Commitment?

Mentors commit to an hour a week meeting with the family. Once a month there is an evening meeting held with the Builders of Hope committee to share the participant's progress.

Who is the Ideal Mentor or Budget Coach?

There is not an "ideal" person for either of these roles. We seek individuals that are empathetic and passionate about helping others, free of judgement. Someone willing to share their knowledge and experience while actively listening to the families' challenges.

Does the Mentor Work Alone?

Mentors are either paired with another mentor or a budget coach. They are never in the home alone with the family. EASS staff are also available to assist the with any concerns that arise that may need additional support for the family.

PA State Background Check, EASS Volunteer Application, and Child Abuse Clearances are required for this volunteer position.


