





THE HOLY GOSPEL

LUKE 13:1-9

P: The Holy Gospel according to Luke the 13th chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

P: Asked about current tragic events, Jesus turns a lesson about whether suffering is deserved into a hard call to obedience. He then tells a parable that holds out hope that the timeline for ultimate judgment will be tempered by patience.

- ¹At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices.
- ² [Jesus] asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans?
- ³ No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did.
- ⁴Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on

them—do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? ⁵No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did."

⁶Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. ⁷So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' ⁸He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. ⁹If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"

C: receive our prayer.







THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION


