MINISTER'S MESSAGE



I Really Need All Twelve Days of Christmas This Year

I wrote this a few years ago, but with Thanksgiving being so late in 2024, I feel the same way this year:

Everybody is celebrating the New Year. But I'm not done celebrating Christmas. There are a few reasons for this.

One of the reasons is that there actually are twelve days of Christmas. In the Church Year, Christmas begins on Christmas Day and ends on the Day of Epiphany on January 6th.

Many people don't know this as they start celebrating Christmas on the day after Halloween. This makes December 25th the 55th day of Christmas instead of the first. People are tired of celebrating by the 26th. They swing into New Year's mode. However we Lutherans celebrate the season of Advent and maintain still that Christmas starts on December 25th.

But there is another reason why I am glad there are twelve days of Christmas this year. Despite the 55 days I had to get ready, I discovered this year that on December 25th I had not sent out all the cards I wanted, I had not purchased all the presents I wanted and I hadn't seen all the people I wanted to see.

One thought is that I'm getting a little older and slower. But there's more to it than that. This year I really need all twelve days of Christmas. It's been a rough year. Politics has made everybody crazy and angry. I need the Baby Jesus to stick around for a while. I need the manger scene, the shepherds, the wise men, the angels and Mary and Joseph with all the animals to just hang around into the new year.

MINISTER'S MESSAGE CONCLUDED

Through the dark Winter. Into the Spring and heat of Summer and past the Fall. Beyond. Always. I need to stand beside the Baby God in the quiet deep night two thousand years ago and know only that moment. To look up and see only the star. I'm just really not ready to let go of that.

It's not a good time to venture into a new year without Jesus, without the comfort and guidance of God. It's never really been a good idea. But this year, particularly, you take a great risk venturing into the new year without God.

Don't do it.

You'll never make it.

You'll be consumed by all the bickering.

Fortunately for all of us the spirit of Christmas and the presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit extends beyond the New Year and actually beyond Epiphany. Jesus says in Matthew 28: 19, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

This is really good news. What this means is that we don't have to worry about politics or anything else. We can go confidently into the new year knowing that the Peace and Love of Almighty God will guide and direct us.

Every year people wonder what is going to happen in the new year. And every year the same thing happens: a lot of good happens and a lot of bad happens. But one thing is for certain: if we go into the new year trusting in people instead of trusting in God, we will surely be disappointed.

So maybe you are like me. Maybe you didn't get everything done by December 25th. Well, that's alright. Because December 25th is actually about Jesus beginning. Jesus beginning to be who He was meant to be: the baby who grew to be the Savior of the world.

If you're taking down the tree and putting everything away feeling that things aren't really over....well, you are right. Jesus is just starting! Day one through twelve. And beyond. Happy New Year!





"This Little Light of Mine"

"This Little Light of Mine" is an African-American song from the 1920s. It was often reported to be written for children in the 1920s by Harry Dixon Loes, but he never claimed credit for the original version of the song, and researchers at the Moody Bible Institute, where Loes worked, said they have found no evidence that he wrote the song. It was later adapted by Zilphia Horton, amongst many other activists, in connection with the civil rights movement.

The origin of the song is unclear, but the phrase "This little light of mine" appears published in poetry by 1925 by Edward G. Ivins, a writer in Montana. In 1931, the song is mentioned in a Los Angeles newspaper as "Deaconess Anderson's song". In 1932, the song was mentioned in a 1932 Missouri newspaper. In 1933, the song was mentioned in newspapers as being sung by a chorus at an African Methodist Episcopal conference in Helena, Montana, and then various other churches around the United States later that year.

During the Civil Rights movement The Freedom Singers belted out songs to get through protests in the early 1960s. "This Little Light Of Mine" helped steady their nerves as abusive police officers with billy clubs threatened to beat them or worse. It kept them from being afraid. They would start singing a song, and somehow those billy clubs would not hit you. It played a very important role during the movement.

A Message from the Discipleship Committee

November 27, 2024

Disciples of Mellingers

The committee has been prayfully trying to evaluate our ministry to God's children in our area who have a housing problem in their lives.

We have been told of families in our area living in motels and not being able to get out of that environment. They have jobs and are trying, but cannot overcome the crises they live in day to day.

Churches in the Cocalico Area who were a part of "Love Inc" – Homes of Hope – which have now separated due to financial and client differences.

Ephrata Area Social Services and the local area churches – Trinity Methodist in Denver, Swamp Lutheran in Reinholds, Faith Lutheran in Denver and St. John's UCC in Denver have formed a new program called "Builders of Hope".

The Disciples in Life Committee at Mellingers has been prayfully researching this type of new ministry at Mellingers and have been in dialog with guidance from church council. With the approval of church council, a grant application to the Mission Fund of the Lower Susquehanna Synod has been submitted requesting \$10,000.00 and a pledge of additional \$5,000.00 from Mellingers to join with the new program at Ephrata Area Social Service and area churches in a "New" program called "Buildings of Hope".

EASS will be the lead agency in the program offering screening and selection of a possible family who need help.

The area churches will offer financial assistance, support counseling and maintenance of the rental house in Adamstown owned by Bollman Hat Company.

After we expressed interest in being part of the program at their monthly meeting, which was attend by Pastor Tim and Barb & Bob Getz, a motion was made by a present member to invite Mellingers Lutheran Church to become a member of the program which passed unanimously.

Barb & Bob Getz signed a commitment to represent our congregation on the committee which meets monthly. Our initial involvement will be to help and support fund raisers to pay rent, equip the house, pay utilities and maintain the rental living unit.

Our future involvement may be to help tutor families in learning and doing things to become a self-sustaining family in our community. Scripture tells us in Luke 10th chapter verse 25 thru 37: Be the one who shows Mercy.
