#### PASTOR'S MEDITATION

#### This I Yet Possess

Yes, it's that joyous, bell ringing, coin clinging, song singing time of year again when people are more depressed than at any other time. The reason is probably because there are expectations of happiness but realities of loss.

Thinking about plunging into despair this Holiday season? Consider this:

"When life becomes meaningless, and when one is drowning in despair, any kind of do-it-yourself faith does not work. When the bottom has dropped out, one discovers that one's ego power has been reduced to zero and that it takes two to believe, for one must borrow faith from someone still strong in faith when one's faith is gone. It is a word from the outside that promises radical change and brings comfort. The biblical God is a lover who offers good news in the crucified Christ, who endows victims of ego power with gospel power."

If you are diving into a deep darkness even as all the Christmas lights are going up, please consider the above quote from my old mentor, professor and friend from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg.

The reason that Jesus Christ was born, the reason we celebrate is precisely because we <u>can't</u> do this heavy lifting by ourselves. We need help. We need others. We need God.

Dr. Gritsch was a man who taught me the nuances of the simple faith my parents gave to me. He would say things like, "If the fundamentalist preacher asks me, 'Eric, do you believe in Jesus Christ as your Savior?!' in a threatening tone, I might say, 'Well, I'm really not sure. But my Grandmother taught me this and she believed this and that's good enough for me!""

# Hymn of the Month for December "O, Little Town of Bethlehem"

The Christmas carol "O Little Town of Bethlehem" was written in 1868 by Phillips Brooks. Brooks was the second rector of the Church of the Holy Trinity on Rittenhouse Square, Philadelphia.

He was in Bethlehem on Christmas Eve in 1865. He went to the service where they were singing Christmas carols at the site where Jesus was born and he was inspired to write this carol. Brooks wrote the text to the song and asked the organist at the time, Lewis Redner, to write the music for it.

Three years later, at Christmastime, remembering that experience, Brooks penned the words to this beautiful song for the children's choir of his church. The organist of the church put music to the lyrics and on Christmas Eve, 1868, "O Little Town of Bethlehem" was sung for the first time.

We don't know too much about Brooks, although he was a published author and his church did erect a statue of him standing near a cross in his honor. He may have been quiet and unassuming, we aren't sure. But from the words of the song we know he was impacted by his experience in Bethlehem.

Bethlehem was about six miles outside of Jerusalem, the birthplace of our Lord Jesus Christ. Meaning *house of bread*, it was also the *City of David*. This is where Samuel, the prophet, anointed David to be king over Israel. Then, in the book of Micah, the prophet tells that the Messiah would come from this small *unimportant* town of Bethlehem! By the time Jesus was born, Bethlehem was just a tiny village.



But it didn't matter the place. This was God's plan. He didn't choose to come with fanfare and crowds broadcasting the news. He chose to come humbly with the host of heaven proclaiming His birth!

You see, it doesn't matter how insignificant or little we may be, we have the potential to be used for something great in the Kingdom of God!

Just like the little town of Bethlehem, if God chooses us, He will make a way for us to be used and to be used in a big way. Don't sell Him short!

The city of Bethlehem today? Approximately 60,000 people live in and around the area. It is home to one of the most sacred Christian sites in the world, the Church of the Nativity, circa 330 A.D. It still stands over a cave believed to be the very spot where Jesus was born. Of course, this tourist site is one of the oldest surviving Christian churches in existence today, making Bethlehem a thriving tourism destination.

True, tourism is not Bethlehem's destiny. But centuries ago, the God of the universe picked this *Little Town* for the birth place of the Messiah. And that *Child of Bethlehem* can come and abide in us today.

#### **ORGAN COMMITTEE REPORT**

During our first meeting on June 4, the Organ Committee (Vicki Kissinger, Nancy Hain, Kim Craven, Andy Leonhard & Troy Adair) discussed current & possible future issues with the current organ.

Current – Chimes are not working, blower for wooden pipes needs electrical work and wiring is brittle.

Future – Limited parts availability & more wiring getting brittle.

Other concerns include availability of organists in the future & the price of a new organ.

We discussed options for the replacement of the current organ:

New hybrid organ, Used hybrid organ, Specialized keyboard (similar to Clavinova) and Piano

At the next meeting on July 25, we discussed the following items which were researched after our first meeting:

- Vicki found out from Greg Gehman of the Organ Guild that there are students still specializing in organ playing in local colleges.
- Vicki contacted Mike from Roger Organ and he stated the availability of replacement parts is good except for the CPU board (if the CPU fails, the organ will need to be replaced).
- Andy researched options with Allen Organ & Viscount Organ the dealers would be out of the area & price would be higher than Rodger Organ (current organ).
- Troy checked with Buch Organ on a price of a new hybrid organ the price would be around \$80,000
- Andy was able to repair the blower with the help of Witmer Motor Service.

After the Organ Committee submitted the above information to Church Council, it was decided that since there are replacement parts available for the current organ and the pipes and the organ are working, we are choosing not to replace the current organ at this time.

Moving forward the Organ Committee along with the approval of Church Council would like to start a fund titled the "Music Equipment Fund". These monies could then be used towards the purchase of new musical equipment in the event that the CPU board of our current organ fails.

If you have question about the report please contact a Council member or wait and discussion can be at the Congregational meeting.
